LANDOWNERS & OCCUPIERS

Please help keep public rights of way open and accessible:

- Keep paths clear of obstructions.
- Do not block or unlawfully divert a public right of way.
- Keep vegetation, crops and other growth from making paths difficult to use.
- Ensure gates and stiles are safe and reasonably easy to use.
- Remember: a public right of way remains a public route, even when it crosses private land.
- **If you need help with clearing paths or improving stiles & gates, then please do let us know; assistance is available!**

PATH USERS

Please enjoy the countryside responsibly:

- Leave gates as you find them.
- Keep dogs under control and on leads where appropriate.
- Clean up after your dog.
- Stick to the designated path and respect crops, livestock and private property.
- Take your litter home.
- Do not damage walls, fences, hedges or other countryside features.
- Be considerate of other people, landowners, farmers and wildlife.
